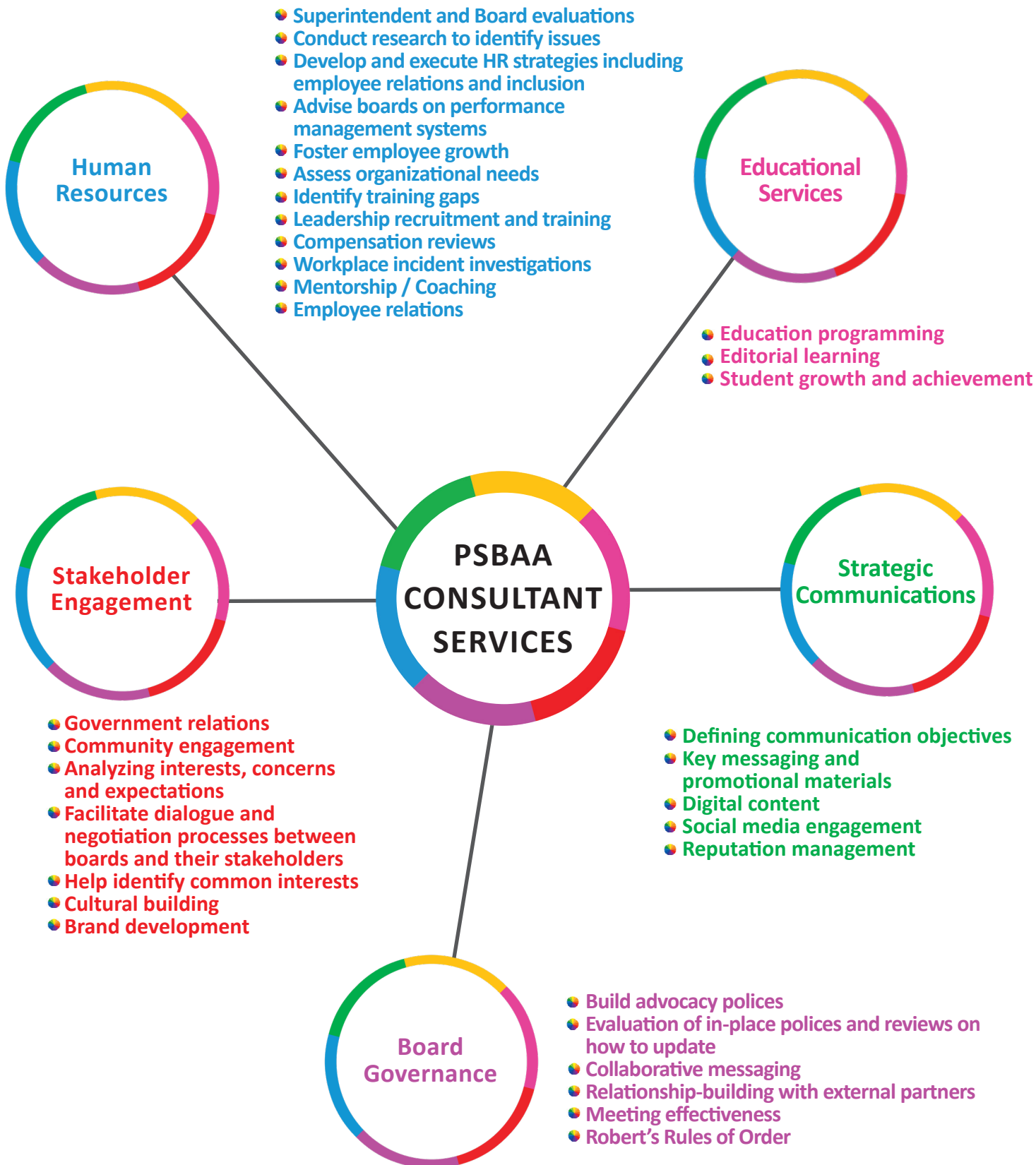

BRIAN CALLAGHAN

During his long tenure with Canadian Rockies Public Schools, Brian was instrumental in leading a seven-year process of community engagement and generative governance that transformed the division's teaching and learning into a true 21st Century learning model known as Inspiring Hearts and Minds. This process was adopted by the provincial government as it developed its foundational Inspiring Education document.

Brian implemented an International Student Program in 1995. Thirty years on the program has welcomed more than 1,000 students from more than 20 countries who live and learn in the Canadian Rockies for five-month or one-year stays sometimes longer, providing the division with significant non-government revenue with which to expand and grow other programming.

He has also worked closely with German education officials and researchers in areas of common interest. Most recently organizing a fact-finding trip to Alberta by a delegation of German Education Ministers.

Brian has been a part of the PSBAA for many years and his passion and expertise in public education is far reaching. He is the respected resource for board members and his skills are sought after.

He has also served as the College of Alberta School Superintendents President, Chair of Council on Alberta Teaching Standards and Alberta School Attendance Tribunals.

Darrel managed a billion-dollar budget for EPSB, which serves more than 120,000 students. Graduation rates in the Division increased by close to 20% over his Superintendent career thanks to the collaboration and efforts of staff across EPSB. He also established the Equity Fund, an initiative designed to redistribute resources to schools based on social, economic and student needs. Additionally, Darrel is widely recognized for spearheading the Division's Career Pathways initiative, a K-12 framework designed to help students discover passions and transition seamlessly into post-secondary or the workforce.

His proactive leadership earned him the title of 2020 Canadian Superintendent of the Year. He has been further honoured with the College of Alberta School Superintendents EXL Award and the University of Alberta's Alumni Honour Award. Darrel holds an MBA (2006) and was a recipient of the Governor General's Gold Medal for academic achievement at the graduate level. In 2021, Darrel completed a graduate certificate in Executive Coaching.

He helped generate insights from both qualitative and quantitative methods and reported results to Alberta Education, participants, and stakeholders on a yearly basis from 2019 to 2022.

Dennis has worked with multiple education partners to develop a critical, systematic, and research informed knowledge base within the field of educational leadership. He strongly believes, educational leadership positively impacts teaching and learning.

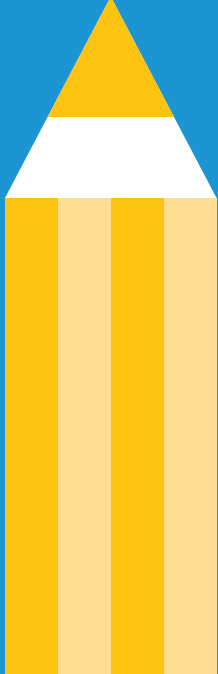
